WENATCHEE — Wenatchee Valley College's Student Activities Office presents Phillip E. Walker's lecture "Multi Cultural Sensitivity — Six Simple Strategies" at 11 a.m. Jan. 23 in the Van Tassell Center Student Lounge.

College officials call the lecture a lively, non-threatening discussion which encourages audiences to actively share their stories of success and failure in this area.

Designed to identify usable, concrete techniques, the lecture was presented in seven states in 1991 alone.

Walker has spoken to such diverse audiences as The Suffolk University's Graduate Management Seminar, as the keynote speaker for the National Association for Dramatic and Speech Arts, the Gilford High School (NH) graduation speaker, as well as at more than 500 colleges during 15 years of national touring with his one-man Black history play, "Can I Speak For You Brother?"
